3. CHECK THE RECORD COMPLETION OF YOUR CREDENTIAL IS IN YOUR PROFILE

1. In your LinkedIn profile, scroll down to section "Licenses & Certifications".
2. If it's not already there, select the + sign to add your certification.
3. In the field "Issuing Organization", start to type in "Change Hacks" and our logo will appear for you to select.
