Interesting Fact: Quaker preacher-artist Edward Hicks painted over 100 versions of this peaceful scene inspired by Isaiah 11:6–9, showing wild animals and children living together in harmony. In the background, he often included William Penn making a treaty with Native Americans, symbolizing peace on earth as well as spiritual unity.
