BIG IDEA: Every child is a gift from God, bringing hope for today and tomorrow.

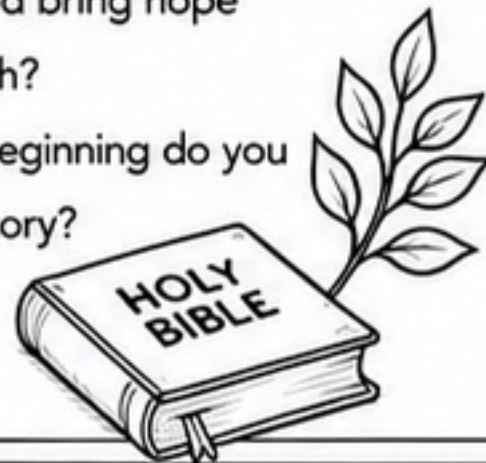


READ TOGETHER

FAMILY ACTIVITY — OUR FAMILY STORY OF HOPE

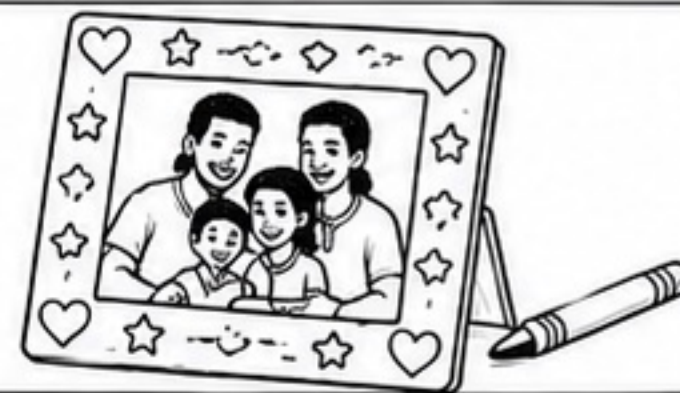
Draw a picture or write about a time when God helped your family through something difficult.

Tell one story about how God has been faithful to your family.

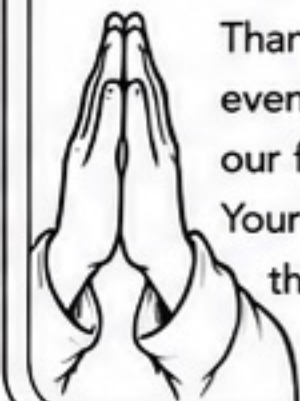


Check off your challenge each day and celebrate your progress together!

Thank You for giving us hope, even when life is difficult. Help our family trust You, celebrate Your faithfulness, and remember that every child is a precious gift from You. Amen.



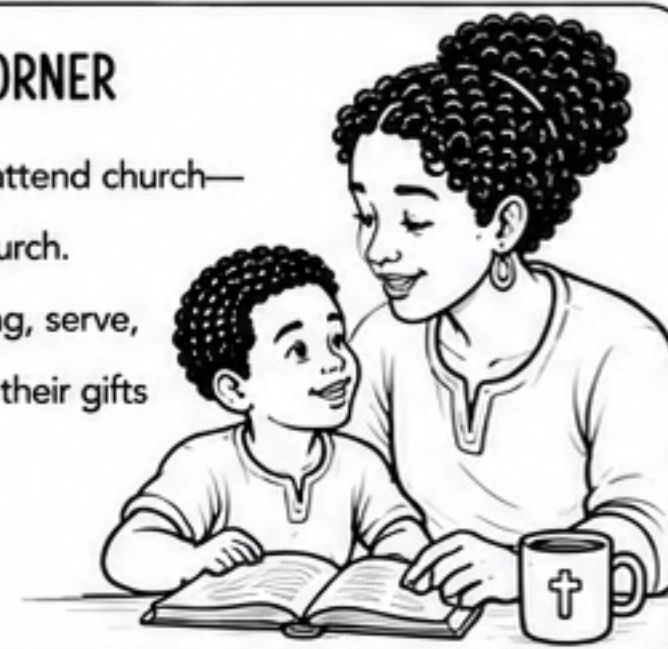
SHARE YOUR STORY
