## Leading in Vulnerability?

### REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1

If disclosure is selectively revealing parts of yourself that you don't want others to see, to be contrasted with vulnerability – revealing parts of yourself that you don't want to see – would you call yourself more disclosing or vulnerable?

Is your church a safe place to fail? Do you see evidence of that in the not-yet followers of Jesus that are attracted to your community?

Is the prevalence of vulnerable confession widespread in your community so that it feels more like a Recovery Group atmosphere?

Looking at Pete Scazzero's categories of “Weak and Vulnerable” vs “Proud and Defensive,” which set of descriptors sounds more familiar to you as a leader?

Do you have a true spiritual friend (other than your spouse, if you are married) from whom no secrets are hidden? If not, what's preventing you?

6

What frightens you about leading with a limp, becoming more of a weak and vulnerable leader? Does your team/church/board even want that from you? What might that tell you about the culture of your organization?

The speaker mentioned cultivating “a gospel culture” where people are free to fail, where mutual confession is common, and forgiveness is routinely practiced in life together. Does that sound like your team/church/organization?

What do you want to do differently after this conversation? What's a tangible next step?
