

Lessons in Good Trouble: Extensions

LEVEL UP your coding skills with [Prodigy Learning](#) and their [Coding Credentials](#) program! The agent is an amazing resource in Minecraft that is often under-utilized by students. Consider checking out Prodigy Learning and their coding courses, and revisiting the lesson to use the agent to help with design challenges, such as building an elevator or creating a labyrinth in the museum gardens.



Other Extension Ideas:

- Have students research social justice movements in Canada (Black Lives Matter Canada, Disability Rights, Dorothea Palmer, Georges Erasmus) create a world with NPC's to highlight and share their research explaining why their topic is important for Canada.
- Students curate a list of resources using Wakelet, further exploring social justice movements, different activists, protests, etc These curations can be a class collaboration to bring together more resources for further investigation.
- Students create a presentation for their peers that goes into depth on one activist, protest, or social justice movement.
- Students create a 2-minute screencast explaining a social justice movement and the results of that movement including key leaders and events.
